It's time for us to leave Kona. 19th of December we 'll fly off to Accra and travel by road to Togo. And we will travel together this time, because the visa extension for Wilson worked out well!

Ellen staffed the IPHC-school and taught every Wednesday afternoon primary healthcare in the DTS. It is a new program on campus and the campus is excited to continue with it.

Wilson and Communication department

Wilson worked in the communication department. There's a great leadership there and he learnt a lot. Besides his work there, he worked on different stories and movies and helped the IPHC-school to prepare for outreach. Bringing Gods Word in action, if necessary with words. One of our goals is to build relationships around the YWAM UofN campus in Noepe. This will help our longterm team in the future.

But we still have a debt to pay off to the campus. \$100 for Wilsons internship, and then another \$1000 for housing the last 3 1/2 months. We would be very happy if we could leave Kona without debt. One great testimony: last week our outreach team needed \$29,000. Yesterday it went down to \$2,800! We bless all our supporters, the \$10 and the \$1000.

The office in Rotterdam has gracefully allowed us to send some boxes with personal belongings with their container to Togo. Thank you Lord AND Mercy Ships!

Prayer warriors

We have been blessed to have experienced missionaries around us here. They give us advice and share their experiences to help us stand on their shoulders as we are moving to Togo. One thing we have been told 3 times by different people is this: More than anything else, seek people who are willing to pray for you on a very regular base. As we want to build Gods Kingdom in West-Africa, the enemies' biggest desire is to destroy it. In the Bible book Nehemia we see a great example. The enemy plans to attack the builders of the wall. They start to work in pairs. One keeps working, one stands on guard to cover the back of those people. Together they work to build the walls, defending and building.
